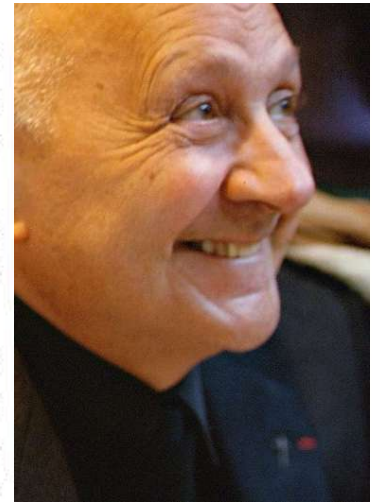
On Sunday 12th February 2017

Joseph Wresinski was born in France on the 12th February 1917. He grew up in a poor neighbourhood, where his family experienced extreme poverty and social exclusion. He became a priest in 1946, at the age of 29. In 1956, Wresinski's bishop suggested that he become the chaplain of a camp for the homeless on the outskirts of Paris. Here Wresinski was struck by the terrible poverty faced by the families. Having never forgotten the feeling of shame and exclusion experienced during his own childhood, Wresinski vowed to make his life one with the families of the homeless camp. He passed away the 14th February 1988. A formal Church Inquiry into the cause for Wresinski's beatification started in 1997.

Joseph Wresinski (1917-1988) is the **initiator of the United Nations' Day for the Eradication of Poverty** (each 17 October) and the **inspirational figure behind the development of the UN Guiding Principles on Human Rights and Extreme Poverty** (adopted in 2012).

In 1965, together with French sociologist Jules Klanfer, he first introduced and developed the **concept of "social exclusion"**, now broadly used worldwide to describe the social impact of poverty.

All his life, he was a strong advocate of people trapped in chronic poverty across different generations. The **"Wresinski approach"** inspires new ways to fight poverty worldwide. It recognises people with experience of poverty as partners in designing, implementing, monitoring and assessing public policies. In 1957, Wresinski founded **ATD** in a slum near Paris, which is now **All Together in Dignity** with over 100 projects in 40 countries.
