La Grande Rand'ODD #Cycle4SDGs

Celebrating the **17 Sustainable Development Goals** (SDGs) and the promise to "**Leave no one behind**" at the time of the First UN Summit for **Agenda 2030**, four years after its adoption on 25 September 2015

The #Cycle4SGDs will take place from 21 to 27 September 2019 and will allow Irish and French cyclists, including several from disadvantaged backgrounds, to ride together from Dublin to Paris at a time when the international community will mark the 4th anniversary of the adoption of Agenda 2030 and the 17 Sustainable Development Goals.

The bike ride will involve 12 cyclists along its entire route. It can be joined and supported by local cyclists from time to time. At each stage, the cyclists will meet with local elected officials and will give them a copy of the Declaration of the New York Summit on Sustainable Development (to be adopted on 24 September 2019).

Why a project between Ireland and France?

In 2015, Ireland and its Ambassador David Donoghue played a key role in finalizing the agreement between 193 countries and the adoption of Agenda 2030. Ambassador Donoghue ensured that the "leave no one behind" promise is clearly stated in the agreement:

"As we embark on this great collective journey, we pledge that no one will be left behind. Recognizing that the dignity of the human person is fundamental, we wish to see the Goals and targets met for all nations and peoples and for all segments of society. And we will endeavour to reach the furthest behind first." (paragraph 4, introduction)

The start and finish of the Grande Rand'ODD (Cycle4SDGS) will take place between two Human Rights and Poverty Stones: from the Custom House Quay in Dublin, to the Palais Chaillot in Paris (where the Universal Declaration of Human Rights was adopted). A majority of civil society actors are convinced that **an approach based on the guarantee of fundamental rights** is the basis of an inclusive and equal society that **leaves no one behind.** More at www.leavenoonebehind.ie
